You Can't Keep a **Good Dog** Down

Cloverdale, a golden/shepherd/chow mix, is an irrepressible three-year-old that Kyra Jenkins adopted from a shelter in Mississippi at ten months. "I saw a picture of him online in a Red Flyer wagon," Kyra said, "and I knew. We got him in Rhode Island. He came out of the truck and peed on my foot. That was it.

"Cloverdale is the best dog I've ever had," she added. "I don't even like calling him a dog. He's an old soul. He 'talks' and is stubborn. I say that he loves like a golden and protects like a shepherd/chow."

Last fall the shepherd/chow part of him almost proved to be his undoing. Kyra's fiancé, Rico Holley, is a house painter on the Vineyard where the couple live with their two children. Cloverdale goes to work with Rico (and even has his own lunchbox, according to Kyra). Last October, Rico was on a ladder when he heard a truck coming down the dirt road. Before Rico could stop him, Cloverdale bolted for the truck. The driver slammed on the brakes but it was too late: he had run over Cloverdale's paw and the dog was dragged.

Kyra, a CNA at a



retirement home, was at work. When she got a chance to check her phone, Rico had left 20 frantic messages. She got the kids and headed to Vineyard Veterinary Clinic in Edgartown. Roger Williams, DVM, told her the injuries were serious. "They weren't sure Cloverdale would make it," she said. "One leg was broken, the other was mangled and they didn't know if there were internal injuries." Terrified, she went to see Cloverdale. "He was muzzled and bloody, but sat up when he saw me. It was like he was saying, 'I'm okay, Mommy.'"

Concerned that the

front leg and severe road burn on his right front leg. Stubbornness works!

After five more days in the clinic, Cloverdale came home. His bandages needed changing every day; he couldn't handle stairs so Kyra slept on an inflatable mattress downstairs. Six weeks later a toe was amputated so the bones in his paw would line up correctly. Today he's missing some fur on one paw but is doing great – galloping on four legs and running on three.

Because of the extent of Cloverdale's injuries, treatment costs were high, but Vineyard Veterinary Clinic did what it could to help offset some of the financial burden. As an affiliate of The Sampson Fund For Veterinary Care, the clinic provided services at a reduced rate and suggested that the couple apply for Sampson Fund assistance. Kyra's kids, Matthew, 12, and Aleeya, 4, even brought in their piggy banks. "I don't want anything for Christmas," Matthew told his mom. "I just want Cloverdale to come home."

"I'm so grateful to the folks at The Sampson Fund," Kyra said. They were so helpful and generous to us. I can't thank them enough."

leg might need to be amputated, Dr. Williams discussed sending Cloverdale off-island. Kyra couldn't afford it. The doctor said he would do his best, explaining that the next 72 hours were crucial. It was totally up to Cloverdale.

An IV catheter was inserted to reduce the dog's fever, which he pulled out. "Cloverdale," Kyra warned, "you've got to leave the catheter alone." The next day Dr. Williams called. "He asked me if I was sitting down. I thought that was it." Again, Cloverdale had pulled out the catheter. But he was standing... despite a fractured left
