Lucky Lucy

Lucy, a 10-month-old Plott Hound/Lab mix, has already been through a few adventures during her brief life. First, there was her big journey to Cape Cod from Sweet Paws Rescue in Alabama. Only three months old, the pup came to live with Duncan Kimball in her new "forever home" in Falmouth.

About two months ago a small growth appeared on the left side of Lucy's belly near her back. "I thought it was a cyst or an ingrown hair and didn't really worry about it," Duncan recalled. Eventually, however, the growth began to change and get bigger. Although Lucy hadn't seemed bothered by it at first, she started throwing her head back toward the growth as if trying to get at it. "It was inflamed and had turned black," Duncan said. "I knew I had to do something."

He brought Lucy to Falmouth Animal Hospital to have it checked out. A veterinarian said the growth would have to be removed and sent to a lab for a biopsy to see whether it was benign or cancerous. That was unsettling news for Duncan, who works as a maintenance mechanic at the Marine Biological Laboratory.

"If it was cancer, I knew I wouldn't be able to afford to keep sending



her for treatments. I didn't have the money and really didn't know what I was going to do." Fortunately, Falmouth Animal Hospital is an affiliate of The Sampson Fund For Veterinary Care, and its staff told Duncan the fund might be able to help out. "I had never heard of the fund but I got in touch with them and applied, and they said yes." With that encouraging news, the procedure could now take place.

"They removed the growth and did the biopsy, the whole nine yards,"

he said. Luckily, it turned out to be a histiocytoma, an abnormal but benign tumor that doesn't typically recur. And Lucy is now "A-OK," according to her owner. "She's doing great and is back to her super high energy, rambunctious, smart self. She's a really good dog."

Duncan is grateful to The Sampson Fund for the financial support. "I have to say it brought tears to my eyes. They are awesome. I really appreciate it."
