# **Annie's Story**

Joanne and Walter Bracken of Mashpee have had more than their share of difficulties. Over a decade ago Walter was diagnosed with lymphoma; he now has leukemia. Annie, their 12-year-old poodle, provides him with emotional support.

"I got Annie, a miniature poodle, for my husband when he got sick," Joanne explained. "She was seven weeks old. She truly is the best dog. I've never had to raise my voice with her. She's never on a leash. I call her 'an angel.' No matter what, dogs always love you."

Last year Annie became ill. "I was so worried about her. She wouldn't move. I had to carry her around the house," Joanne said.

Unhappy with the care Annie was receiving from their veterinarian, Joanne took her to Barnstable Animal Hospital in Hyannis. It turned out that she had severe periodontal problems, something that can affect small breeds. Despite Joanne's efforts to keep up with Annie's cleanings, the disease had progressed. It was so bad that Barnstable Animal Hospital veterinarian Dr. Robin Joly suspected mouth cancer. Fortunately, the biopsy came back negative.

Although Joanne was "ecstatic" that little Annie didn't have cancer, the situation was serious. The infection had moved into bone.

"Annie had several medical issues [including Cushing's disease], but her teeth were the biggest problem," Dr. Joly explained. "She had many abscessed teeth and a major infection. Her gums were just mush. You could see every root. We put her on



antibiotics to get the situation under control, but she needed surgery."

This presented a financial hardship for the Brackens. Due to his illness, Walter is unable to work and Joanne has a seasonal part-time job. "I would have begged in the street," she said, partially in jest. "I would not let anything happen to my dog." Barnstable Animal Hospital is affiliated with The Sampson Fund For Veterinary Care. Dr. Joly told Joanne about the Fund and handed her an application. She applied and the Fund agreed to help.

Annie needed three periodontal surgeries over the course of a year. (Dr. Joly and fellow veterinarian Dr. Betsy Powers shared surgical duties.) The last operation occurred this past March. "Annie is not a young dog and there aren't many teeth left, but we are doing everything we can for her," said Dr. Joly. "This is a special case. Annie is a lifeline for Joanne and her husband, and Joanne is determined to do what she can for her."

In addition to being determined, Joanne is extremely grateful – to Dr. Joly for telling her about the available assistance and to The Sampson Fund for providing financial support for one of the surgeries. "The Fund helped us so much and Annie is doing great. She takes four medications a day, but a week after surgery she was running up the stairs!

"I really appreciate what The Sampson Fund has done for us. I won't forget about this and hope someday to be in a position to give back."


